Face Coverings (indoors)		Face covering/masks are recommended but not required. Face covering/masks are required at all times in all indoor areas by all individuals entering the buildings.			
Masking Requirement Compliance		Students, staff, or visitors and spectators to school-sponsored indoor events shall wear a face covering during substantial and high transmission levels. If an individual refuses to comply, they will be asked to leave the premises. If an individual refuses to leave the premises a trespassing referral will be made to law enforcement. (BOE approved 10/25/21)

Physical Distancing		Social distancing will be done to the best of our ability.			
Student/Staff Illness		Follow Grant County Health Department and Wisconsin Department of Health Services guidance.			
Isolation/Quarantine		<p>Exposure, Quarantine And Isolation Guidelines For Individuals That Are Not Fully Vaccinated:</p> <p>*Persons with close contact to an individual with COVID should immediately be quarantined at home for 14 days from last contact with the infected individual.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Local health authorities will make final decisions on the length of quarantine. -Potential options to reduce quarantine include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -After day 7, if asymptomatic and a negative PCR test result (test must occur on day 6 or later). -After day 10, if asymptomatic. -Over the entire 14 day period, everyone should monitor for symptoms, you must wear a mask the entire time (no exemptions or exceptions allowed), and maintain social distancing/avoid crowds. <p>*Persons with symptoms of COVID or a positive COVID test without symptoms should isolate themselves from others and contact their primary care provider to discuss evaluation and testing.</p> <p>**These individuals will need medical clearance with negative testing in order to return to school and activities, or they will need to follow the previously established 14 day quarantine protocol.</p> <p>Exposure, Quarantine And Isolation Guidelines For Individuals Fully Vaccinated or Can Provide Approved SARS-CoV-2 Positive Test or SARS-CoV-2 Positive Antibody Test:</p> <p>*Fully vaccinated people that develop COVID symptoms should isolate themselves from others and contact their primary care provider to discuss evaluation and testing.</p> <p>**These individuals will need medical clearance with negative testing in order to return to school and activities, or they will need to follow established CDC quarantine protocol.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -At least 10 days since symptoms first appeared, AND -At least 24 hours with no fever without fever reducing medication, AND -Other COVID-19 symptoms are improving (loss of taste and smell may persist for weeks or months and should not delay the end of quarantine). <p>*Fully vaccinated people with no COVID-like symptoms following an exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID do not need to quarantine or test.</p> <p>*They should monitor themselves for symptoms for 14 days after exposure, and if symptoms begin, they should isolate and contact their primary care provider.</p> <p><i>**If a student/staff member is able to provide a previously documented SARS-CoV-2 positive test result that was obtained through a government/clinic/hospital/FDA/EUA-FDA approved test, this student or staff member shall be treated the same as a vaccinated student/staff member for quarantine purposes.</i></p> <p><i>**If a student/staff member is able to provide positive SARS-CoV-2 antibody test through an EUA FDA approved or FDA approved hospital/clinic/ SARS-CoV-2 serology test, this student or staff member shall be treated the same as a vaccinated student/staff member for quarantine purposes.</i></p> <p>(BOE approved on October 25, 2021)</p>			
Testing		Call 211, Grant County Health Department (608-723-6416), or your health care provider for testing information and availability. On-site diagnostic testing may be available at school.			
Hand Hygiene		Hand sanitizer is available in all classrooms, buses and throughout the buildings. Hand hygiene & respiratory etiquette will be encouraged.			
Cleaning & Disinfecting		High contact areas will be disinfected a minimum of twice per day. If a positive case occurs, affected areas will be cleaned and disinfected.			
Transportation		Vehicles (including high contact surfaces) will be disinfected after each route.			
Ventilation		All ducts were recently cleaned and unit filters are cleaned/replaced monthly.			
Vaccination		Together with Boscobel Pharmacy and Grant County Health Department, Boscobel Area Schools hosted on-site vaccination clinics for staff and students. The district also supported a drive-through immunization clinic for students. The district is willing to hold additional vaccination clinics (including for ages 11 and under, if approved).			
Signage and Communication		COVID-19 signage will be posted to reflect current practices. Protocols will be posted to the district website.			
District administration and the school nurse will review transmission level frequently, and this will be tracked on the COVID-19 log and communicated via the dashboard. If changes in masking are necessary, parents/guardians will be notified via Skylert and changes will occur the next day. All employees of Boscobel Area Schools are mandated reporters of COVID-19.
